PASTOR'S NOTES

All Grown Up and Living in Ohio!

It was late afternoon when the phone rang, and even though the caller ID was unfamiliar, I picked up the receiver, "Ridglea Presbyterian, this is Roger," I said into the void. There were a few crackles on the line, but for a couple of seconds that was it; just as I was about to hang up a voice came on. I was thinking that this was going to be a telemarketer, asking for the "owner" or "the person who makes decisions about your copier" or one of about a dozen other opening lines, but instead there was just a simple "hello?"

Turns out it was Scott, all grown up and now living in Ohio! Well, I didn't know until later that he was living in Ohio, and I didn't really know Scott, except that it was the name on the caller ID, but I had just finished one thing and the next thing was still waiting to be started, so here I was chatting with Scott, who called with a question: do we have records of baptisms? Scott's parents were members of Ridglea in the 1960's, and they told Scott that he had been baptized at Ridglea, but he needed to know what the date of that baptism was. Was there any way of finding out?

I asked a few questions, wrote everything down, and figured that this was going to take a few hours of wading through some old books. I let Scott know that we would be in touch to let him know if we do, or do not have any information on his baptism, but we don't keep copies of certificates, we just keep dates and names in a register. I could tell he was a bit disappointed, like the mental image of a 16x20 gold-edged, embossed certificate, with his name and baby foot-print, laying in a vault in the dusty reaches of the church, waiting for the day he would come searching for it (today!) – that mental image was dissolving as I told him that maybe we'd have an entry in a ledger.

I assured him, though, that if we can find such an entry, we could send a letter saying "our records indicate..." if that would be okay. Sure, that would be great, he said, and here's my phone number and my e-address.

A short little phone call, all of about six or seven minutes. After I hung up I was planning to give my notes to either Patricia, our office manager, or Karen, our Clerk of Session, so they could search through the fire-proof filing cabinet filled with a couple dozen volumes of minutes, rolls, and registers, if there was even a chance that such records might exist. Curious myself, I went to the cabinet, so that I might let Karen or Patricia know which drawer to search. Well, the records do exist, and Scott (and his sister, born in 1957) were both baptized on November 22, 1959 by the Rev. Clifford W. Williams, and a letter has already been sent to Scott that verifies all of that.

I share this little story for a couple of reasons: those records exist because of the work of a whole bunch of people, particularly those who have served as Clerk of Session, along with the church secretaries / office managers, that have kept Ridglea – and most every other worshipping community since Moses – running smoothly. And, because what the people of faith did, decades ago, still matters today. In our celebration of baptism, we pledge to guide, nurture, and encourage those who are baptized to know and love Jesus Christ, and those commitments go far beyond the walls of a congregation. Do you remember Scott and Susan, or their parents, Roy and Phyllis, the Lawrence family? Do you remember when Rev. Williams pronounced "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit"? Well, sixty-two years later Scott is all grown up and living in Ohio, still being nurtured in the knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. Thanks be to God!

November, 2021

It's the time of year to count our blessings. Every fall with a deep sense of gratitude, PWomen have contributed to the Thank Offering. This special offering started in Springfield, Ohio in 1888 has granted almost \$27 million to more than 1,600 projects in the U.S. and around the world.

In 2021, twelve projects have been chosen, three are international. Here is a sampling of just a few:

- 1) Belize—a Sunday School/Day Care Center serving 50 children of single parents.
- 2) Guatemala—Open Books Ministry to increase literacy for children in rural areas.
- 3) Zambia—Chasefu Theological College—provides women's hostel to encourage more female candidates.
- 4) Child Advocacy Services in Hammond, LA—provide council and comfort for abused children.
- 5) Cancer Association of Anderson, S.C.—provide a vehicle and driver to assist patients with no transportation to the treatment center.
- 6) Habitat for Humanity—Orlando, FL –mentor 100 households to prepare them for ownership.
- 7) Peacehaven Farm, Whitsett, N.C.—a kitchen renovation to help this program for developmentally delayed adults.

Session Meeting Notes for October 21, 2021

- The Ridglea Presbyterian Church regular stated session meeting took place on Thursday, October 21, 2021, in the RPC Sanctuary. The Reverend Roger Harwerth moderated the meeting. RPC Clerk Karen Landon took the minutes of the meeting. Also in attendance were John Sauvey, Director of Music; Betsy Kibler, Moderator of the Board of Deacons; and several guests.
- The minutes of the September 23, 2021, stated session meeting and the August & September 2021 budgeted financial statements were approved.
- Beth Duncan presented information about creating another RPC time capsule: (the
 time capsule from the Camp Bowie location was opened and displayed for the
 dedication service of our building). The session approved the purchase of a small
 storage compartment that would be recessed in a wall in which to store items for the
 time capsule. Possible items to be added to the time capsule were discussed.
- The session reviewed the RPC Manual of Administrative Operations and received the 2020 Financial Review from the Finance and Budget Committee.
- The Session voted to have one Christmas Eve service at 6:00 p.m.
- The next RPC stated session meeting will be Thursday, November 18, 2021, at 7:00 p.m. in the church sanctuary.

The next stated Grace Presbytery meeting will be Saturday, November 13th at First Presbyterian Church of Fort Worth. RPC will be represented by up to 3 elder commissioners.
