PASTOR'S NOTES



Is It Any Surprise?

During a recent sermon I made reference to a newspaper story about the increase of the non-religious population in the United States. Those are people who, when participating in surveys about their religious affiliation (Jewish, Catholic, Buddhist, Protestant, etc.) reply "none." In the early 1970's just 5% of respondents placed themselves in that category; by the early 2000's it had

reached 15%, and in 2023 the category was at 28%.

The sermon addressed the assertion, from sociologist Jörg Stolz, that "People don't like being told what they should [or should not] do ... especially when the teller isn't especially qualified. Increasingly, people are saying 'Why do I need a pastor to tell me what to do? What makes them any more insightful than this academic journal?' The rise of the nones is the manifestation of a move toward greater autonomy of individuals." (January 24, 2024 edition of the *Washington Post*; "More Americans are nonreligious. Who are they and what do they believe?" by Michelle Boorstein) The focus of that part of the sermon was the idea of authority, for Mark's original audience and in the centuries since. The congregation in Capernaum was reacting to both the message and the healing abilities of Jesus, expressing astonishment at what they heard and saw (Mark 1:21-28).

A pastor addressing the question of "why do I need a pastor...?" can easily sound defensive (especially while standing in a pulpit!), and there was undoubtedly a bit of that, but beyond the topic of pastors is the larger concept of "the greater autonomy of individuals."

Individual autonomy is important. Yes. Unfortunately, the Church has denigrated and battered the idea of individual autonomy for too long. Individual autonomy is different, though, than what Jesus is addressing in Capernaum, which is overcoming religious strictures and structures. What Jesus is illuminating and modeling in the synagogue is inclusion and relationship and honor within the larger community. A man who had been deemed unworthy, unwelcome, unfaithful, undesirable, and even more, was brought into relationship, through Jesus. In nearly every account of healing attributed to Jesus, there is an element of witness and connection to the larger community. In Mark's gospel, Jesus is emphasizing the importance of relationships, especially with people who are outside of our comfort zone.

For too many decades too many Christian leaders have tried too hard to define the community of faith in ways that exclude, that shame, that denigrate the relationships that the gospels highlight. So, is it any surprise that in five decades nearly a third of the country is asking "why do I need a pastor...?"

Of course, congregations are not the only opportunities for people to connect, and we should also confess that sometimes congregations can be as insular and exclusive as civic, sport, or professional clubs. However, the pastors I know, and the communities they serve, work hard at building relationships, providing safe and welcome spaces, practicing compassion. Pastors like Lander in Sherman, Drew in Granbury, Matt in Fort Davis and Robyn in Fort Worth; Neill in Gaithersburg, Maryland, Marci in San Francisco, California, and Janet in Mt. Holly, North Carolina, and many dozens more. To paraphrase Ridglea's vision statement, we, like others, strive to be compassionate and inclusive every day, while seeking to grow in spirit and hope. We, like others, are less concerned about the need for, or the authority of pastors, and more concerned about the connections between autonomy and community. When we say "see you in church," it is less about the buildings, and more about the people. You are welcome!

























Community Music Connection Teaching Music Connecting People
