



PASTOR'S NOTES



Getting Into the Swing of Lent (adapted from a previous article)

Every so often I am asked to present devotionals or presentations for groups. One of my favorite starting points is an article from *The Atlantic Monthly Journal* titled "Throwing Like a Girl." (the magazine is now simply *The Atlantic*). The

article is largely about muscle memory and the physics of throwing a ball, and how it is by sheer repetition that a person becomes adept at throwing objects. Without repetitive motion, the action of the shoulder, arm, and wrist is awkward and one is said to "throw like a girl" (though the article does make note that many females throw quite well, because of repetition, and that the phrase is quite simply offensive).

As a way of understanding the subtleties of repetitive action, the article suggests trying to throw with one's "non-dominant" hand – the one that isn't used to eat, write, or throw with. It is a strange, and often humbling experience for a right-handed person to attempt to do something with their left hand (or vice-versa), particularly something as "easy" as throwing a ball.

Not only do I use that article for groups, I occasionally practice what it suggests, particularly with an old softball bat that rests just inside my office door. When I need to clear my head or get a sharper focus, I often pick up that bat and roam up and down the hall, slowly swinging at imaginary pitches (sermons, newsletter articles, and devotionals are examples of when I might go roaming the halls, waiting for new insights or perspectives – when no one else is in the building).

I'm naturally right-handed, but when I'm swinging at imaginary pitches I don't always swing from the right. It takes more concentration, but I will occasionally turn my hands over on the bat and swing from the left side. Those left-sided swings aren't nearly as adept as those from the right, but that's okay – I'm not swinging from the left so that I will actually hit a ball from that stance.

I'm going through those different, odd, uncomfortable motions as a way of reminding myself that I need to stretch beyond my comfort, beyond my routine, beyond my capacity. I go through those awkward, unfamiliar motions because they remind me of how I might do familiar tasks better.

As a time of reflection and discernment, the season of Lent is an opportunity for each of us, and all of us, to reflect on our routines, our practices of faith, our relationships with the world and with God. Lent is an opportune time to consider the burdens or habits that we may have accumulated and would like to discard, as well as considering new approaches to comfortable traditions.

Lent is often considered a time to "give up" things, like chocolate, or smoking, or swearing, as a way of bringing focus to our faith. While there is nothing wrong with giving up these or other habits, Lent can also be a time of adding a new emphasis to practices of faith. Consider, perhaps, praying in a fashion that is different from your routine (such as changing posture from sitting to standing, or with a lit candle to focus upon), or praying at a time of day that is often taken up by others tasks (while opening the mail, or during lunch).

Like trying to throw a ball with the opposite hand, or swinging a bat from the opposite side, Lent can be a time of bringing new attention to how we already practice our faith, and how we can become even more attuned with our faith.


