PASTOR'S NOTES



PERHAPS

It is highly possible that every person who has ever lived has struggled with food, or with eating, or with hunger at least once in their lives, and

probably more than once. Parents feeding children who are hungry, or finicky, or allergic, or simply growing, think a lot about food (as do children). People traveling are often met with food options they have not previously considered, or encountered, think about food. A lot of social activities include food, especially at churches. Potlucks! Anniversaries! Dinner with Friends! Graduation! Chili Cook-Off! Thanksgiving! Birthday! Communion! The Bible has dozens of food-related stories, including apples, grapes, olives, honey, bread, beef, pork, mutton, fish, and more; some of the stories are struggles and some of them are celebrations.

It is highly possible that every person reading these paragraphs have thought about what and how much they eat (or don't), and also highly probable that those thoughts have spilled over to what and how much other people eat (or don't). Our daughter Amanda has recently earned certification as a sports nutrition coach (through the National Academy of Sports Medicine) and the process took a lot of time, effort, and support, and we are mighty proud parents. Becoming certified is a big deal, one of her amazing accomplishments (teacher! mom! spouse! friend! musician! athlete!), and achieving this level of knowledge and experience brings opportunities and responsibilities and challenges. Folks have started reaching out, asking her for insights, information, and assistance, and those conversations have already begun to illuminate the challenges, opportunities, and responsibilities that are ahead.

It is highly possible that people are reaching out, asking questions, seeking information because our daughter admits to having struggled, admits to having journeyed into trends, and expresses positive curiosity more than negative criticism. Thinking about her accomplishments, and the avenues still ahead, there seemed to be some connections, some similarities with the accomplishments, avenues, and opportunities in the settings of church, faith, and belief.

As we rush up to, through, and past another Easter celebration, we often share familiar stories and traditions, and we too easily overlook or forget the different histories and struggles of faith, hope, and love that we bring into these celebrations. For instance, there are folks who hunger, who worry, who struggle with the "diet" of God they were fed for many years. For instance, there are folks who rarely, if ever, travel and explore, let alone consider or accept a "menu" of diversity and divinity. It is difficult, but important to remember, to encourage, to help one another along our Easter journeys, and it is also important to reach out, even to lean upon people who have experiences, knowledge, and perspectives which can enlighten our journeys. Perhaps, when we gather around food, we might listen to folks who consider more than hunger. Perhaps, when we gather around God, we might listen to folks who consider more than themselves.




Update from The Finance and Budget Committee

Financial Results presented at the January 29, 2024 Congregational Meeting portray a financially healthy church. The year end 2023 financial report (which arrived after the Congregational Meeting) did, however, show expenses exceeding revenue, contrary to the nearly balanced budget presented for the year. Explanation is warranted.

The fact that expenses exceeded revenue was the result of numerous discussions and decisions not to withdraw available funds from investment accounts, but to take advantage of our strong position in cash reserves. Be assured that Ridglea Presbyterian Church is in solid financial health. The Finance and Budget Committee continues to monitor financial matters and will advise the congregation as to any material changes as we go through 2024.

Thanks to the generosity, dedication, and work of faithful members, RPC is able to project a nearly-balanced 2024 budget, cover normal operating expenses, meet special needs, and provide funds for participation in God's work within and beyond our walls.
