# **PASTOR'S NOTES**



### **A Moment or Three**

Being "the new pastor" in town meant being the one who preached at the community Thanksgiving service, hosted by the Baptists that first November in ministry, and also being the one who spoke at the Memorial Day service at the local cemetery in May. There were four other pastors participating in the Thanksgiving service alongside the new pastor, but all of those old-timers assured the newbie that Memorial Day was a

solo event – except, they didn't share that information until late April. When the new pastor realized they would be "on their own" at the end of May, there was a moment or three that crept toward anxiety. Thanksgiving is one of those holidays that school children talk about every year, for weeks on end, so even the newest pastor has a wheelbarrow of knowledge about the Mayflower and the Pilgrims and Native Americans and turkeys and maize and giving thanks and so on. Memorial Day was little more than the "last holiday" before the end of the school year, so there was not nearly as much to draw upon. Hence, the moment or three that crept toward anxiety.

What does a pastor say, or do, at a Memorial Day gathering, standing in a field of tombstones? Surely it is different than a graveside funeral? Surely it is less a celebration, and more of a ... what? The new pastor could count on one hand the number of family members – fathers, grandfathers, uncles, cousins, siblings – who had been in the military in the past sixty-plus years, so there weren't any family stories to draw upon either. Another moment or three that crept toward anxiety.

Before search engines and the internet and social media, finding answers to questions like this meant either talking to people with experiences, or going to the library, or both. So, the new pastor reached out to other pastors, and to mentors, and to a few seasoned church members for their insights and suggestions and helpful hints. A handful of hours were spent in a local library and a few books were borrowed. Hours and hours of information were whittled down and down and down for this gathering, this community event, set in the solemnity of tombstones.

Expecting forty or even fifty people at the cemetery, the pastor was surprised when the crowd turned out to be fourteen, including their spouse and two children. More and more whittling, because forty people might sit through forty minutes of prayers and scripture and homily and benediction and such, but a dozen people – including four- and eight-year old's – they need a smaller portion of appreciation. Another moment or three that crept toward anxiety.

An opening prayer, a few paragraphs about the post-Civil War roots of the celebration, then a poem about the lingering grief from that war: *The Blue and the Gray* by Francis Miles Finch. Some reflections on community, and faith, and hope, and service, and then one more poem: *Warm Summer Sun* by Mark Twain. Then a benediction. One of the older gentlemen approached the new pastor with a handshake and said that was mighty fine, mighty fine, and appreciated the brevity of the service – not quite fifteen minutes. The gentleman's wife said "now, don't you be teasing our pastor!" and the gentleman said there was no teasing intended, quite the contrary. He looked at the young pastor and said, "There was a speech given at Gettysburg that went on for over two hours, and no one cared to remember what was said. Then Abraham Lincoln stood and spoke for less than five minutes and no one dared to forget what was said."

Decades later, the no-longer-new pastor appreciates the traditions and scope of Memorial Day, and still finds solace in the forlorn imagery of that century-old poem by Francis Miles Finch. Reflecting on the aftermath of war, Finch writes: "under the sod and the dew/ waiting the judgment day/ under the laurel, the Blue/ under the willow, the Gray." In one of his letters, the apostle Paul writes "there is no longer Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female, for all are one in Christ."

As a nation, we take time to remember those who have given their lives in service to our country, with equal honor. As a community of faith, we take time to remember the resurrection of the One who lives in service to the realm of God, so that glory will be known to all; a living memorial, a moment or three, of grace.










#### **Matthew 25 Action Team**




We coordinate groups that meet for lunch as well as dinner. You may now indicate if you would like to participate in a lunchtime option.
