A Berry Good Day



Since the chancel flowers are a different arrangement each week, I simply admired the beauty of the orange rose blossoms that glowed in the sanctuary, unaware that Brenda had told anyone that orange is my favorite color. There had also been a small "heirloom" basket, covered by a tea towel, just outside the Eclectic Café classroom, but it looked like it had been set there on purpose by someone, and for someone, so I left it alone, unaware that it had a half-dozen varieties of treats.

What a wonderful surprise! The beautiful orange roses, the heirloom gift basket of snacks, plus a table filled with desserts, all bursting with blueberries (my favorite fruit)! I was truly caught off-guard and left speechless. It was amazing to think of all the behind-the -scenes work that went into putting together this fifth-anniversary surprise.

When Brenda and I came to Fort Worth, in the late summer of 2019, the horizon was unlike anything we had moved toward. Solo and Head of Staff pastorates are different than interim pastorates, but Ridglea's Ministry Information Form was looking for a type of relationship, a type of ministry, that seemed close to the connections and collegiality I have tried to build, and have cherished, so with the presbytery's input we undertook a twelve-month interim relationship. At the same time, Ridglea Presbyterian (RPC) was also moving toward a new horizon, having sold its generational home on Camp Bowie Boulevard and living in temporary quarters in River Oaks.

Since it was a new opportunity, and also a presbytery requirement, Interim Ministry Training (now called Transitional Ministry) would happen in the spring, but in the meantime listening, asking, suggesting, wondering – the tools that had been helpful for 30-plus years – still seemed to be useful, so that's what was offered and practiced. Somewhere around the fifth or sixth month, with the work of moving into a new building *and* continuing the pastor search process on everyone's radar, it was becoming more and more clear to me that RPC is an amazing congregation; we felt called, together, to move from temporary to installed ministry. Though it was still planned and anticipated, for experience and skill-building purposes, the Interim/Transitional Ministry Training never did happen; in the spring of 2020 the COVID-19 pandemic cancelled nearly everything, just as RPC was moving into their new home on Southwest Boulevard.

What began as a one-year, interim relationship, back in August of 2019, with an unknown, unforeseen, transitional horizon, has turned into five-years-and-counting of a grace-filled ministry of growth and joy. Thank you so much for all the blueberry goodness, but even more, thank you for all the support and challenges, all the lessons and opportunities that have shaped this handful of years, and the horizons of ministry that await.





The men's prayer breakfast has been a vital part of Ridglea's mission and ministry for decades. We enjoy a hearty breakfast and pray for people and events around the world.






