Unfettered

Christ the King Sunday, also known as the Reign of Christ, is the last festival day of the church's liturgical year, putting a bow on the thirty-plus weeks of Ordinary Time that began back in May. Which means that the season of Advent, the season of preparation and anticipation, is upon us, as the church's liturgical year begins anew

on Sunday, December 1st (note: almost always the Sunday after Thanksgiving). However, the month of November seemed to kick-start a different mindset of preparation and anticipation in the aftermath of the presidential election.

Prior to the election, a colleague wrote a reminder that following Christ can and will put us at odds with much that the world cherishes, and that whoever is elected, Christians continue to be responsible to follow the way of our Lord, which is marked by humility, forgiveness, integrity, and self-giving love. One of the most helpful sentences my colleague shared was that whoever leads this country is not as important as who leads our souls. (many thanks to the Rev. Christine Wagner at First Presbyterian of Hays, Kansas)

The election is over, and a new administration is on the horizon, and we need to continue to be prayerful in our discernment, in our civic participation, in our discipleship.

Every so often the "shuffle" feature on my playlists will bring up a song from one of the handful of discs of Latin Jazz, or Celtic Folk, or Italian Romance, or French Opera that I have in my music library, and such was the case when sitting down to try to pull my thoughts together for this short article. Listening to Spanish lyrics, an Italian aria, or a Gaelic lullaby is a reminder that we live in a very big world, and there is a lot that is beyond our understanding. Even without knowing the lyrics, the musicians, with their harmonies and melodies, carry messages of joy, sorrow, romance, hope, unfettered by translation. Just as joy, or sorrow, or longing can be sung in a dozen languages, so can the commitments to justice, mercy, and lovingkindness be shared through a dozen different administrations.

The season of Advent points toward the return of Christ and our preparedness for such a time. Even as all around us the joyful birth of the babe is anticipated, we are also bold enough to look beyond the stable, beyond the cross, beyond the tomb; to look beyond what we think we understand. Administrations, and even nations come and go, but we are called to a higher covenant, a deeper commitment, loving the Lord our God with all our heart and soul and strength and mind, and loving our neighbor as ourself.




Looking Ahead:

Remember to bring your Least Coin (pennies) to your Circle Meetings!



Thank you to all who helped with donations of pillows and electric toothbrushes for the children living in the Presbyterian Children's Homes & Services foster care village in Itasca. In November, we donated 40 electric toothbrushes and 30 pillows.

The Fellowship of the Least Coin (FLC) is a global ecumenical prayer movement for justice, peace, and reconciliation led by Christian women for women and girls all over the world. Women of all ethnicities, nationalities, ages, educational backgrounds, and socioeconomic statuses are invited to participate in this global movement by praying for justice, peace, and reconciliation in their own lives whenever they experience personal conflicts and challenges. As well, they are invited to pray for justice, peace, and reconciliation for women and girls all over the world who face injustice, violence, and poverty every day.

It includes "least" coins... As tokens of these prayers, women are encouraged to set aside the least coin in their country's currency (ex. penny, sentimo, paisa, etc.). Only the least coin is offered so that women of all backgrounds and means can be equal partners in justice- and peace-making. These least coins are then collected by Christian women's groups and ecumenical women's organizations in countries and regions all over the world. They are then forwarded to the Fellowship of the Least Coin (FLC) Fund, which is faithfully stewarded by the International Committee for the Fellowship of the Least Coin (ICFLC).

It leads to *real* justice, peace, and reconciliation... Every year, the FLC Fund is disbursed as grants for post-secondary education and training for women; grassroots projects that empower women and girls, advocates for their rights, and work to end gender-based violence and poverty; and provide relief in times of natural and human-made disasters. In this way, all of our least coins can contribute to *real* justice, peace, and reconciliation in the lives of women and girls all over the world!




The RPC Women are collecting quarters in the Narthex after service every second Sunday of the month to assist Westaid.
